
# **PALAY PROCUREMENT**

For the 4th quarter of 2020, NFA procured 402,898 MT of palay, which is 87.01% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 463,040 MT. This is 3.35% or 13,048 MT higher than the 389,850 MT accomplishment for the same quarter last year. The high procurement for October can be attributed to the onset of procurement season and the high buying price of NFA rice compared with the prevailing ex-farm prices.


#### **DISTRIBUTION**

For the 4th quarter of 2020, NFA distributed 152,246 MT of rice, equivalent to 283% accomplishment of the quarter's target of 53,793 MT. This is 43.30% or 46,005 MT higher than the 106,241 MT accomplishment for the same quarter last year. The high distribution can be attributed to the massive rice releases to DSWD, LGUs and other relief institutions, intended for COVID-19 relief operations.

# **PRICES**

Although the NFA no longer performs price stabilization function, prices are still being continually monitored, since they served as important input in the operations activities and decision-making of the NFA Management.

#### **Ex-Farm Prices**

NFA's buying price of ₱ 19.00/kg. is higher than the average prevailing ex-farm price of ₱15.75 /kg. at ₱3.25 /kg. This is also higher by ₱3.46/ kg compared to the average ex-farm price for 2019 at ₱15.54 / kg.

NFA's buying price for yellow corn (YGN) at P 12.30/kg. is ₱0.29 /kg is higher than the average prevailing price ex-farm price. On the other hand, NFA's buying price of ₱13.00 / kg for white corn (WGN) compared with the prevailing average ex-farm price of ₱13.10 / kg is lower by ₱0.10 /kg.

The average commercial prices in the wholesale and retail levels of Well-Milled Rice (WMR) and Regular Milled Rice (RMR) generally decreased compared to last year's levels by P0.40/kg, P0.34/kg, and P0.15/kg, P0.38/kg., respectively.

Likewise, prices of yellow and white corn in the wholesale and retail levels generally decreased for this quarter. Significant decreases were recorded at P1.68/kg, P 1.26/kg, P0.71/kg and P1.86/kg respectively.

# **NFA INVENTORY**

As of December 31, 2020, NFA's stock inventory of 6,982,313 bags (total rice equivalent –TRE) or 349,116 MT is good to last for 10.55 days, based on the daily rice consumption rate. However, based on Average Daily Sales of 78,416 bags, the inventory is good to last for 89.04 days. It should be noted that NFA's inventory is only part of the national rice inventory of the entire country.

The total average volume of assessed NFA stored grains for the 4th quarter of 2020 was 9,732,887.50 bags, composed of palay, milled rice and corn grains. Stocks fit as food (rice) and feed (corn) represent 99.995% of the total assessed grains. Totally damaged milled rice stocks for disposition consisted of 477.77 bags, equivalent to 0.05% of the total stock inventory.
