# NFA ADMINISTRATOR RODERICO BIOCO VISITS MINDORO ISLAND

Administrator Roderico Bioco took two (2) days out of his busy schedule to visit the island of Mindoro which is one of the top palay producing areas in the Philippines in order to observe the practices of private rice processing businesses and improve NFA's operational system when it comes to facility efficiency on rice production.

Moreover, Mindoro is the main source of the rice stocks in Southern Tagalog as it is the biggest palay surplus area in the region providing almost 90% of the total regional palay procurement. With the completion of the construction of two NFA warehouses in 2022, more farmers in Occidental Mindoro benefit with these facilities as more palay deliveries can be catered by the branch.

On March 29, 2023, NFA Administrator Roderico R. Bioco with SAA Roger Navarro and AAO John Robert Hermano graced the inauguration ceremony and blessing of the third newly constructed 100,000 bags capacity warehouse (GID 6) at San Jose, Occidental Mindoro. The new administrator led the ribbon cutting, ceremonial acceptance of the warehouse and unveiling of marker witnessed by NFA Southern Tagalog Region heads namely RM Piolito C. Santos, ARM Atty. Marko C. Callanta, Branch Managers Mark Jing Tayactac, Lilibeth B. Agua, Dennis N. Mejico, Regional Engineer Bryan Atienza and the NFA Occidental Mindoro staff headed by BM Sherry Christine Milanes. The honorable Mayor Rey C. Ladaga of LGU San Jose, PFAC Vice Chairperson Carlos Morales, and some farmer leaders were also present at the Administrator Bioco also met the employees of Occidental Mindoro Branch and informed them of the administration's plans and the status of the ongoing NFA Restructuring.

With the management's plan to digitize the systems and modernize facilities of the agency, Admin. Bioco with the NFA executives visited Five Star Ricemill, one of the ricemills in the province with modernized facilities, and was assisted by Mr. Jan Patrick Ramirez, one of the operational heads of the ricemill. They also inspected newly constructed NFA warehouse in Magsaysay on their way to Oriental Mindoro.

On their official travel to the neighboring province, they stopped by at NFA Oriental Mindoro warehouses located in the municipalities of Roxas, Pinamalayan and Naujan; and inspected the properties and facilities within the warehouse compounds. Admin. Bioco also took the chance to meet the branch employees at Calapan City and updated them of the current position of our agency.

After their hectic itinerary, Admin. Bioco left a message of commendation to the officers and staff of the branch offices for their contributions to the buffer stocking mandate of the agency. With the data and observations on facilities and practices, the good administrator believed also that Mindoro is a key production unit of NFA strategy for food security.

# PRES. BONGBONG MARCOS APPOINTS RODERICO R. BIOCO AS CHIEF OF **NATIONAL FOOD AUTHORITY**

The NFA's new Administrator, Roderico Rayo Bioco, is a known expert in the field throughout the country to recommend of agriculture with decades of experience as a corn, cassava and livestock farmer, an addressing the welfare of our more than industrialist building major corn postharvest facilities in the country and an agricultural policy advocate, protecting the welfare of our smallholder corn

He obtained his BS Mathematics degree from Ateneo de Manila University in 1989 and specialized in Statistics from the University of the Philippines in 1988-89. While in college, he was also very active in social work, student activism, and sports, being a member of the college football craft policies on corn production and varsity.

Prior to his appointment as the new Administrator, he was the CEO of Mindanao Grains, a corn processing company based in Bukidnon that he established in 1999 to address the he perennial problem of corn farmers with a goal of establishing a financially sound business model bound by a real social commitment. He founded the Philippine Maize Federation, Inc. (PhilMaize) in 2001, a national organization of corn farmers and cooperatives.

Roderico Bioco was also a former president of the Bukidnon Giant Bamboo (BGB) Resources Corporation, former chairman of the Bukidnon Kaamulan Chamber of Commerce and Industry, Inc., and former governor of the Philippine Chamber of Commerce and Industry Northern Mindanao.

In 2000, he organized corn farmers for favorable policies in government, 400,000 corn farmers. He built the Reina Mercedes Corn Processing Center in Isabela Province in 2010 with the objective of reducing the post-harvest losses of smallholder farmers. The 2,000mt per day grain drying and 75,000mt storage project which services 20,000 ha of corn and benefits 10,000 farmers is the biggest post harvest facility for corn in South East Asia.

Rod Bioco also helped the government postharvest projects, ushering in the shift to biomass mechanical dryers, as well as initiating major hydro and irrigation programs, including the: Jalaur River Dam project in the province of Iloilo; the east of Cagayan river in Isabela; and the Pulangi V of Bukidnon.

Lastly, he is the current Chairman of the Philippine Red Cross - Bukidnon Chapter since October 2016, and as Vice Chairman from July 2013 to October

As he leads NFA, Administrator Bioco believes that modernizing the agency's facilities will ensure more local farmers will deliver their produce to the agency and eventually, contribute to the country's buffer stocks, ensuring the country's food security.

# RM SANTOS REPRESENTS NFA REGION IV AT BAYANIHAN FESTIVAL

RM Piolito C. Santos, representing NFA Region IV, attended a momentous event in province of Occidental Mindoro in celebration of the first harvest festival dubbed as "Bayanihan Festival in Sablayan" last April 26, 2023 at Panikian Lake, Sablayan, Occ. Mindoro.

This was the first harvest of an agricultural project and a pioneering partnership of the Municipality of Sablayan and Tao Seeds under Rice to Rise (R2R) Program. Tao Seeds is known for its mission to develop and to produce the best hybrid seeds in the country and uplifting the lives of Filipino rice farmers while R2R Program is a platform where key players in the rice value-chain strategically work together to provide the needed support to small farmers.

During the event, Mayor Walter D. Marquez of Sablayan, Mayor Angelina F. Tria, Dr. Frisco M. Malabanan - Consultant of Office of the Usec. for Rice Industry Development, TAO Seeds Business Unit Head Joseph Arlan Fajardo, VCA Manager Nelson C. Paraguison, and Mr. Artemio Cazareno - Regional Seed Coordination & Agricultural Center Chief II were also present.

As 86% of NFA Region IV's buffer stock comes from Occidental Mindoro, RM Santos took the opportunity to express NFA's appreciation to all farmers for their patronage in selling their palay to the agency and the LGU leaders for their continuous support of the noble mission

to provide sufficient buffer stock sourced from local farmers, ready in times of calamities and emergencies.

RM Santos also provided updates regarding the administration's plans to establish state-of-the-art Rice Processing Centers with modernized facilities, such as mechanical driers, silos, rice mills, through a mother and daughter station setup. The mother station would be the bigger facility supporting 10 daughters or smaller facilities, making it more cost-effective. The administration also plans to implement digital transformation through the SARAI Project (Smarter Approaches to Reinvigorate Agriculture as an Industry in the Philippines), which will provide most of the intelligence function/data through an action-research program, funded by the Department of Science and Technology - Philippine Council for Agriculture, Aquatic, and Natural Resources Research and Development (DOST-PCAARD). The project is in partnership with other departments of UPLB to provide and deliver new technology using remote sensing from satellites and to develop new applications not only for NFA but also for Filipino farmers.

During the event, the harvested "Hatao Dinorado" was also introduced, which was cooked and served during lunch, and used as an ingredient in rice delicacies distributed to the participants to prove its quality.

# **BRANCH OFFICES CHAMPION NFA PALLGU PROGRAM**

The NFA Branch Offices in the Southern Tagalog Region have started the year 2023 with several initiatives, including LGU coordinations, ugnayan meetings, and house-to-house campaigns. These efforts aim to bolster the region's palay procurement accomplishments for the first semester of 2023, encourage LGUs and legislators to support them under the PALLGU Program, and express support for government projects that showcase the quality of NFA rice.

With the aim of providing more support to local farmers, branch heads introduced the Palay Marketing Assistance Program for Legislators and Local Government Units (PALLGU) to LGUs in their areas of responsibility. They explained that the provision of a certain amount from their office budget would benefit local farmers in the form of an additional incentive (P1.00-3.00/kg) to NFA's buying price of P19.00/kg.

Last year, the LGUs of Siniloan in Laguna, Tagkawayan in Quezon, and Sablayan in Occidental Mindoro signed a MOA to participate in PALLGU with NFA. The said LGUs added P1.00/kg to NFA's buying price. LGU Siniloan provided a premium of P403,000.00 to NFA Laguna, LGU Tagkawayan gave the NFA Quezon Branch P500,000.00 premium and LGU Sablayan gave P4,500,000.00 to NFA Occidental Mindoro.

This year, the City Government of Calapan pledged P2.00/kg, enough to cover 20,000 bags of palay amounting to a premium of P2,000,000.00, to support the farmers of Calapan City. RM Santos personally visited Calapan City Hall with NFA Oriental Mindoro officials to sign the MOA on March 23, 2023, with Mayor Marilou F. Morillo. With LGUs Infanta and Victoria in Laguna, Mayor Filipina Grace R. America and Mayor Dwight C. Kampitan provided support for the farmers, amounting to P500,000.00 (P2.00/kg incentive) and P100,000.00 (P3.00/kg incentive), respectively, through NFA Laguna.

# NFA REGION IV PARTICIPATES IN KADIWA NG PANGULO PROGRAM

On other activities, NFA Region IV branch offices participated in KADIWA NG PANGULO Program which aims to promote the direct marketing platform designed by the Department of Agriculture (DA) that provides consumers access to quality and safe food items, while ensuring farm producers have ready market.

The Kadiwa ng Pangulo (KNP) is a spill-over of the DA's marketing strategy dubbed Kadiwa ng Pasko, which addressed the high cost of agricultural commodities during the holiday season. The KNP is just one of the programs of the Marcos administration that address the rising food prices due to global inflation. It also gives farmers, fisherfolks as well as micro-, small-, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) rent-free venues to sell their produce and increase their income.

It is a market linkage facilitation program that has removed the unnecessary layers in the trading cycle. Less middlemen adds to the selling value of the products with consumers benefitting from freshly harvested crops and other food items at fair cost. It also capacitates the food growers to be agri-preneurs.

NFA Oriental Mindoro participated the said activity held at Pola, Oriental Mindoro on November 29, 2022 and same with NFA Palawan on December 15, 2022 at Department of Agriculture Compound, Bgy.Sta.Monica, Puerto Princesa City.

On March 1, 2023, NFA Batangas Branch participated in the launching of the "Kadiwa ng Pangulo" Program in Batangas at the Sto. Tomas City Hall, March 1, 2023. President Ferdinand R. Marcos, Jr. graced the launching ceremony and during the launching event, 319 batangueños availed good quality NFA rice at PhP 25.00/kg (30 bags sold). - CL Gutierrez (correspondent)

# NFA REGION IV RELEASES RICE STOCKS FOR ONE-TIME RICE ASSISTANCE FOR GOVERNMENT PERSONNEL & WORKERS

After the Office of the President issued Administrative Order No. 2 in December 2022, the NFA management carefully prepared rice stocks guidelines before releasing them to the concerned government agencies. On April 12, 2023, the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) released PHP1,182,905,000 to the National Food Authority (NFA) for a one-time rice assistance grant to qualified employees and workers of national government agencies.

The grant will benefit 1,892,648 government workers, including Job Order (JO) and Contract of Service (COS) personnel with the grant of one

-time assistance at a uniform quantity of 25 kilograms of rice to all qualified government workers/employees who are still in the government service and/or engaged by government agencies as of Nov. 30, 2022.

On April 14, 2023, the NFA management released guidelines regarding the Onetime Rice Assistance (OTRA) in coordination with the DBM on funds allocation of government agencies. The branch offices in the Southern Tagalog Region immediately started issuing rice stocks in their respective areas, with a total of 598 bags of 50 kilograms being issued in Region IV as of April 31, 2023 for the said activity.

They also discussed the "battered women syndrome" (BWS) and its phases, a psychological trauma that results ongoing physical, psychological, and/or sexual abuse typically inflicted by an intimate partner. The speakers emphasized that respect starts within the family and that proper education on how to respect others should be taught at home to prevent violence and other

On March 28, 2023, the Batangas City Agriculture Office, together with Glomaria R. Ramos, Noreen Faith B. Andal, Sharmaine N. Vitto, and Roshell C.
